Under the Procurement Act 2023, there are new notices for authorities to publish with the overall aim of enhancing transparency.

Suppliers, take note: these new requirements could impact the confidentiality of your sensitive information.

What are your options for protection?

Supplier Concerns

Suppliers be aware: for larger contracts at least **three** of your KPIs will be in the public domain.

Is your competitive edge at risk?



Performance Visibility

Performance is no secret, and your progress against KPIs will be **published** annually.

A **breach** or **under-performance** may also be publicised for all to see.



Contract Modifications

Contract changes? They won't go unnoticed.

Contract modification notices are now **mandatory**, and will set out the **what**, **why**, and **when** behind any modifications.

Suppliers consider the implications.



Practical Concerns

Suppliers may have concerns about the publication of sensitive information.

You can challenge disclosures that may contravene data protection laws as per the Procurement Act.
